This picture was originally painted by Nicolo Barbino (1831–1891) Italian painter of the 18th century whose paintings are mostly about religious and historical subjects. Nicolo Barabino's Madonnas are wrapped in more-than-generous veils that cover not only the head, but also most of the body.

This artwork depicts the Blessed Virgin Mother as the Santa Maria de la Palma (Mary the Virgin of Palm Sunday) or Virgen María, Mistica Palma (Mary, Mystic Palm).
